

A guided tour of Swedish Nature in Stockholm's Royal National City Park



Close to the heart of Stockholm city you will find The Royal National City Park, the world's first National City Park. Here you find unique qualities, heritage sites and ecologically important areas for the city.

Join Robert O´Dwyer, a nature guide from The Greater Stockholm's Nature Guides on a tour in the northern part of the park, Norra Djurgården. He will take you along a trail that is a mix of open landscape and forested areas. You will see the campus of Stockholm University and part of the royal hunting grounds of olden times where the famous wolf hunt took place. You will learn about ice-ages and see how they shaped the Swedish landscape. You will also learn about the Swedes connection to nature and Norse mythology. There will even be a part about the kings and who lived in Sweden and how they changed the park to suit their needs.

At the end of the tour we will return to the University where you can take the metro or bus back to the city or stay a while and take in the many other attractions of the area.
